Volunteering is the best way to experience any burning event – make friends, gain skills and have fun while helping to make Aurora be the best it can be. Everyone at the event is a participant, but without amazing vollies, the event doesn't happen.

GATE CREW

Be the first smiling faces that everyone sees on their way into Aurora. Check tickets, give out wristbands and make sure people have the information they need to have a kick ass burn!

Gate crew shifts are 5 hour shifts between 9am - 7pm, from opening day Wednesday to Sunday.

No prior experience necessary, on the job training will be provided.

GREETER CREW

A very special part of every burning event! Bring your unparalleled energy as you welcome people to the place they'll soon call home. Set the scene for a conscious community by sharing our 11 principles in the most authentic way you know how. Sing about it, perform about it, vibe about it - crew do you!

Greeter crew shifts are 5 hour shifts between 9am - 7pm, from opening day Wednesday to Sunday.

TRAFFIC CREW

The choreographers of Aurora's grand entrance! You'll help participants find their camping spot, directing traffic flow, help people not park in thoroughfares and ensuring everyone gets to their destination safely and smoothly. Think of yourself as the conductors at our beautiful symphony - keeping things moving, helping lost souls find their way, and making sure vehicles can get where they need to go.

Great for people who love being helpful, enjoy meeting new people, and want to see the excitement on everyone's faces as they arrive at Aurora!

Traffic and Entry crew shifts are 4 hour shifts between 10am - 6pm, from opening day Wednesday to Saturday

RANGERS

Rangers roam the burning streets to make sure all of our community has a safe and happy event.

They're peacekeepers, street directories, the beacon of light in the darkness that shouts "I will help you!". Training is provided either before the event, or on the morning of the first day of the event.

Ranger shifts are 6 hour shifts between 7am - 1am, from opening day Wednesday to Monday.

MEDICAL CREW

Be the guardian angels of Aurora! Our medical crew provides care to our community when they need it most. Whether it's treating a scraped knee from an enthusiastic dance session or providing a safe space for someone having a challenging experience, you'll be the steady presence that helps patch people up. Work alongside qualified medical professionals and gain valuable first aid experience while making a real difference in people's burn.

WWVP cards required, some medical training or experience preferred, from basic first aid to more in-depth qualifications, we'd love your expertise on the crew.

Medical crew will work as Rangers on shift this year, they are 6 hour shifts between 7am - 1am, from opening day Wednesday to Monday.

SANITATION CREW

The unsung heroes who keep Aurora sparkling! It might not sound glamorous, but our sanitation crew are absolutely vital to making sure everyone has a comfortable and hygienic experience. You'll be maintaining facilities, restocking supplies, and ensuring our community loos stay clean and welcoming. Plus, you'll have some of the best stories to tell and will be treated like royalty by grateful burners!

It's honest work that keeps the whole event running smoothly - and trust us, you'll be everyone's favourite person when the facilities are spotless.

Sanitation crew shifts are during the week when the event opens and during event. The roster will be finalised in the weeks before the event.

LEAVE NO TRACE CREW (this title may be changed to Positive Impact Crew)

Environmental guardians and earth protectors! Help Aurora live up to our principle of leaving no trace by educating our community about sustainable practices and ensuring we leave our beautiful site better than we found it. You'll be part educator, part environmental warrior, roaming the event to share knowledge about waste reduction, recycling, and caring for our natural environment.

Perfect for people interested in how we leave a lighter footprint on our planet while having an incredible event experience!

KITCHEN CREW

Love to cook? More importantly, love to eat? An army marches on its stomach and you're just the person to fill that gaping hole.

Our kitchen crew starts during the event build and finishes with the clean up crew, so you can choose to come early or stay late. Work off the pre organised menus and cook up a storm for your hard working Aurora family and be the most loved crew on site, join the kitchen crew!

Kitchen crew shifts are during the week before the event opens and in the days after the event closes.

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC INFRASTRUCTURE (DPI)

The backbone of Aurora, DPI is responsible for facilitating... well, everything! You'll work with all other departments during bump in to make sure the site is ready to use and maintained through the event. That means street lighting, kitchen plumbing, water haulage, site signage, machinery; you name it, they facilitate it. As well as working to set up and pack down the event, DPI are on hand during the event to perform a variety of tasks such as filling up generators, general repairs and assist other teams. A rotating roster will be created for crew working during the event once volunteer numbers are finalised.

Experience in events or a trade is a huge bonus for people wanting to join the DPI crew. If you are a skilled tradesman, operate machinery or have previously worked on event set up we would love to have you on board!

Don't have any of the experience listed above but still want to come and help out? We'd still love to have you on the crew!

All DPI crew members will receive main meals on the days they are working from the crew kitchen before and after the event (not during the event though). Delicious, home cooked meals on shift are just one way we show our appreciation for our wonderful team.
